BOWLS ETIQUETTE

Bowls etiquette is based on the principal of courtesy and good sportsmanship.

Please note that smoking, vaping and the use of e-cigarettes is not allowed on the premises of the club beyond the inner car park and that mobile phones should be turned off or at least muted around the green and not used when a match is underway.

Before the game:

- ⤴ Check you know the correct dress code for the game
- ⤴ Make sure you know the starting time of the game and arrive in sufficient time to be ready to play
- ⤴ In a home game always arrive in time to welcome your guests and to help with putting out the equipment (preferably at least 30 mins before the start of the match)
- ⤴ On arrival report promptly to your captain or event organiser

At any time **please do not:**

- ⤴ Drop your bowls on the green
- ⤴ Sit on the banking nor rest your feet on the edge of the green
- ⤴ Drop litter in the ditches, please use the receptacles provided
- ⤴ Take bowls bags into the lounge or dining room. If you wish to use the Whiteknights changing rooms please carry and not wheel your bag through the lounge

During the game:

- ⤴ Shake hands with your opponents before and after the game (kissing is not necessarily appreciated!)
- ⤴ Stand still and *behind the mat* while the player is delivering his/her bowl and avoid making distracting sounds
- ⤴ Avoid sideways movements across the rink, which may distract players on adjoining rinks
- ⤴ Do not allow your shadow to cover the Jack or distract a player who is about to bowl
- ⤴ When changing ends always walk towards the centre of the rink
- ⤴ Stand well back from the developing 'head' and leave all instructions to the designated player
- ⤴ Do not interfere in any way with the process of deciding shots unless delegated to do so
- ⤴ Wait until the result of an end has been declared before moving or removing any bowls
- ⤴ If an umpire has been called, stay well clear of the 'head' until a decision has been made
- ⤴ If you are responsible for keeping the score compare your card with your opponent's at regular intervals
- ⤴ Always inform your opponent and/or Skip if you require to leave the green
- ⤴ Never be heard to criticise the state of the green or other players
- ⤴ Commend good play at all times and acknowledge your "flukes"
- ⤴ If you lose the game remember to congratulate your opponent
- ⤴ Be courteous at all times and refrain from using abusive or inappropriate language

At the end of a game at home

- ⤴ If you have been representing the Club you should offer to buy a drink for your opposite number of the visiting team
- ⤴ Help with returning the equipment to the appropriate storage facility

Duties of each member of the team for Rinks (4 players) and Triples (3 players):

Rinks (4 players)

- ⤴ The Skip is in charge of the rink
- ⤴ The Lead (No 1) of the team that wins the toss or the previous End will place the mat and deliver the Jack
- ⤴ The Lead (No 1) of the team that lost the toss or the previous End will gather the bowls when the end has finished if there is a pusher available, otherwise everyone helps
- ⤴ The Skip is responsible for the Scorecard but may delegate it to another member of the team (usually the number 2 in a rinks match). The Scorecards should be marked by the players playing in the same position on both teams to make the checking of the score simpler i.e. both Skips or Number 2s.
- ⤴ The No 3 will give guidance to the Skip, if asked, when the Skip is bowling and carry out any measuring if necessary when the End has finished. If there is a tight measure the Skips should be asked to measure first and the Skips will call for the umpire to attend if necessary.

In some competitions the Skip and the No 3 will stand at the Head end, this is known as 'Threes up'; the Leads and No. 2s come up to the head when the No. 3 goes to the mat to bowl.

Triples (3 players)

- ⤴ As for rinks except that the No.2 takes the place of the No.3 in a rink.

In a competition or league match it is possible to have "Twos up" in which case the Lead comes to the head as the No.2 goes to the mat to bowl.

Player Code of Conduct Issued: December 2024

We enjoy healthy competition and friendly rivalry at all levels. Our sport will thrive if participants are enjoying great experiences, extracting maximum value from the sport and advocating it to their friends and family.

This Code of Conduct establishes the principles that all players participating in matches under the jurisdiction of Bowls England (and its member clubs/counties) must uphold both on and off the green, ensuring integrity, respect and professionalism.

This Code of Conduct is specific to Players participating in all events under the jurisdiction of Bowls England (including all rounds of events leading to Aviva National Finals). Players are governed by this Code of Conduct and any breaches will lead to immediate referral in line with this document. Due to the nature of the events, it is likely that a form of immediate action will be taken at the event and may be followed up with the appropriate level of further action which will fall in line with Bowls England Regulation 9 procedures and processes.

Purpose of the Code

This Code of Conduct is issued by Bowls England in order to ensure:

- Bowls England's high standards of conduct are clear.
- The rights and enjoyment of anyone involved in our sport are protected and maintained.
- All players are aware of the standards of conduct expected of them, and the consequences of breaching the standard.
- The good name of Bowls England (and its member clubs/counties) and the integrity of our sport of bowls is maintained.
- Our sport is seen by prospective participants as a place they might feel happy and belong.

1. Respect and Sportsmanship

- Show respect to teammates, opponents, coaches, officials, umpires and spectators at all times – winning graciously and accepting that defeat is a necessary part of sport.
- Do not engage in any form of discrimination, harassment, or bullying based on race, gender, religion, sexual identity or other personal attributes.
- Refrain from directing any words, signs or gestures towards opponents or officials that are understood in any language to have an obscene or offensive meaning
- Accept decisions made by umpires, tournament officials and/or staff members with grace, refraining from arguing or showing dissent.
- Play with a spirit of fairness, avoiding unsporting behaviour such as cheating, intentional rule-breaking or non-participation in subsequent rounds of an event without good reason.

2. Discipline and Commitment

- Be conversant with, and comply with, the current Laws of the Sport of Bowls and all Bowls England rules and regulations relating to events under the jurisdiction of Bowls England, including County Championships leading to Bowls England National Finals.
- Adhere to Bowls England Betting Integrity Guidance.
- Adhere to Bowls England Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Policy.
- Adhere to the Anti-Doping policies as set by UK Anti-Doping.
- Do not drink alcohol on the green or within two metres of the green, nor render yourself unfit to play in a match through alcohol misuse.
- Do not smoke (including e-cigarettes/vapes) on the green, surrounding banks or within two metres of any other player or spectator.
- Do not use mobile phones on the green (except in case of emergency, pre-declared medical reasons or other approved exceptional circumstance).
- Avoid engaging in any activities that may bring the sport into disrepute.
- Players must not seek or receive coaching during play except as permitted under the current Laws of the Sport of Bowls.

3. Integrity and Honesty

- Represent your team and sport with pride, ensuring your actions reflect positively on yourself and others.
- Take responsibility for your actions on and off the green.
- Report any suspected misconduct, unethical behaviour or safeguarding concerns promptly.

4. Social Media, Communications and Public Representation

- Adhere to Bowls England's Social Media Policy.
- Use social media responsibly, ensuring posts and comments reflect the values of our sport – collaborative, adaptable, responsible and encouraging.
- Do not make inflammatory, offensive, or unverified statements online or in public forums.
- Players may make public comments or communicate with the media (including web based social media e.g. Facebook, X (Twitter)) in relation to their personal performance provided that they do not make or endorse any public statement that has or may have a negative effect on the interests of World Bowls, Bowls England (or its member clubs/counties), other players, opponents or the sport of Bowls.

5. Player Conduct specific to Aviva National Finals

- In addition to the items highlighted previously, the following will also apply at the Aviva National Finals:
 - Players may only withdraw from the event (either in advance or during) by providing the Tournament Committee with written evidence of a bona fide injury, illness, bereavement or other exceptional circumstance.
 - Players must be on their rink and ready to start play no less than 15 minutes prior to the official start time as published on the draw (or notified in advance by the Tournament Committee).

- Finalists in all events must attend the Trophy Presentation in playing kit. Should anyone not attend, or not be properly attired, no prize money will be awarded.
- Players must participate in interviews for media coverage immediately after a match as requested by Bowls England officials.
- Any contravention of the Player Code of Conduct during the Aviva National Finals will be dealt with by an Emergency Disciplinary Committee during the event and sanctions (see Appendix A) may be imposed immediately – which could result in a player/team being disqualified from the competition and/or whole event.

6. Consequences of Misconduct

- Violations of this code of conduct may result in immediate disciplinary action, which may include but is not limited to suspensions, fines, or expulsion from an individual competition/event/the sport as per Sanctions listed at Appendix A
- By entering the competition, you accept the authority of Bowls England in addressing breaches of conduct.

Appendix A: Player Code of Conduct Sanctions at Bowls England Events including Aviva National Finals

Bowls England will take action against behaviours that contravene the Player Code of Conduct (Sections 1-6 inclusive).

Action will be taken by the designated authorities at the particular event, and will be proportionate to the scale of the alleged offence. Formal disciplinary action may well be taken following the event, and will be managed in accordance with Bowls England's Regulation 9.

Potential Immediate Sanctions include, but are not limited to:

- Verbal warning
- Written warning
- Suspension from individual event during tournament (i.e. Bowls England Mixed Pairs)
- Suspension from tournament (i.e. Bowls England National Finals)

Bowls England reserve the right to share details of the misconduct and any sanctions imposed with the individual's Club and County to ensure full transparency.

Following the event, further action may be taken at Club, County or National Level which will fall in line with Bowls England Regulation 9 procedures and processes.
