

DRESS CODE

Regulation 3.3 (Dress Code) states that ‘*The dress code for playing on the green shall be determined by the Management Committee and formally notified to playing members*’.

The table below indicates which dress code is appropriate for each of the different types of matches.

Match Type	Dress Code
KL, KLV, TVLL league	Greys
County matches, Evening Friendlies including OTL	Greys
Club Competitions	Greys
Ladies Friendlies	Whites
Weekend Friendlies including OTL	Whites
Ladies versus Gents and Captain versus President	Whites
Finals Day Players and Markers	Whites
County Presidents and Bannerette Matches	Whites
Point, Roll ups and Club Competition Markers	Casual

<p><u>Common to all Match Types</u> Regulation bowling shoes. Predominantly white cardigan, fleece, jacket and/or jersey unless they are MEBC issue garments. White bowling waterproofs. Predominantly white hat or baseball cap (plain and/or with club logo/colours).</p>
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<p><u>Ladies’ Section</u> Club Shirts to be worn with both Greys and Whites</p> <p><u>Greys</u> Grey bowling trousers, skirt, cropped trousers or tailored shorts</p> <p><u>Whites</u> White bowling trousers, skirt, cropped trousers or tailored shorts</p>	<p><u>Gents’ Section</u> Club Shirts to be worn with both Greys and Whites</p> <p><u>Greys</u> Grey bowling trousers or tailored shorts.</p> <p><u>Whites</u> White bowling trousers or tailored shorts</p>
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Notes:

- i. It is a requirement under County rules that all members of a team be attired in the same dress code when taking part in a league or county competition.
- ii. In a new member’s first season either an old club shirt or a plain white shirt/blouse is acceptable for all representative matches until they receive their own Club Shirt
